## Indigo<sup>2</sup> IMPACT<sup>™</sup> 250 MHz CPU Upgrade

To complete the Indigo<sup>2</sup> IMPACT 250 MHz CPU upgrade, you must check the date of the PROM chip in the Indigo<sup>2</sup> IMPACT workstation from the command monitor, replace the PROM chip if the date is before September 28, 1995, and replace the CPU.

Follow these steps to check the date of your system's PROM chip:

- 1. Shut down the system.
  - From the System toolchest, select "System Shutdown."
  - If you have set a root password, you are prompted to enter it.

You then see a cautionary message asking you to confirm the shutdown of the system.

2. Click *OK* to shut down without powering off the system.

You see a message window, "Okay to power off the system now. Press any key to restart," followed by a *Restart* button.

3. Click the *Restart* button.

You then see a window with this message: "Starting up the System..." followed by a *Stop for Maintenance* button.

- 4. Click on the *Stop for Maintenance* button. The System Maintenance menu appears.
- 5. Press 5 on the keyboard, or click the Enter Command Monitor icon on the System Maintenance menu.
- 6. See what version of the PROM you have. At the >>prompt, enter:

## version <Enter>

You see a line similar to this:

PROM Monitor SGI Version 5.3 Rev. B10 R4X00 IP22 "Jan. 22, 1996 (BE)"

- The date, which is in quotation marks ("Jan. 22, 1996 (BE)"), tells you the date of the PROM.
- 7. After you have checked your PROM version, enter **exit** to exit the PROM monitor.

You see the System Maintenance menu again. It is safe to turn off your Indigo<sup>2</sup> IMPACT workstation.

- Turn off the power by pressing and releasing the power button found behind the bezel on the front of the workstation. The system systematically powers off.
- 8. Replace the PROM chip *only* if the PROM chip date in your workstation is before September 28, 1995. See "Removing and Replacing the PROM chip" in the *Indigo*<sup>2</sup> *IMPACT Workstation Owner's Guide*.
- 9. To install the 250 MHz CPU in the Indigo<sup>2</sup> IMPACT workstation, see "Removing and Replacing the CPU Module" in the Owner's Guide.
- 10. If you receive a regulatory label with a processor upgrade, it may be one of two sizes:
  - Place the full-size label over the same size regulatory label on the rear of the workstation. See your *Indigo*<sup>2</sup> *IMPACT Workstation Owner's Guide*, Appendix C, "Exterior and Interior of Workstation," for placement of the full-size regulatory label, or
  - Place the half-size label below the logos and over the lower portion of the regulatory label on the rear of your workstation. See your *Indigo*<sup>2</sup> *IMPACT Workstation Owner's Guide*, Appendix C, "Exterior and Interior View of Workstation, for placement of the upgrade regulatory label.
- 11. See the chapter "Maintenance, Safety, and Regulatory Information" in your *Indigo*<sup>2</sup> *IMPACT Workstation Owner's Guide* for information about obtaining your Manufacturer's Declaration of Conformity.
